PAAA Social Events

Program Objectives

- Recognize the effects of age on the pathogenesis and expression of asthma and design a therapeutic approach based on available evidence/trials
- Recognize antecedents of irreversible lung disease at an early age and design preventative therapeutic approaches
- · Develop an algorithmic approach to the patient presenting with chronic dyspnea
- Discuss possible additional diagnostic testing after office spirometry
- Consider additional therapeutic options directed at patients with irreversible changes
- Decide when referral to pulmonary is indicated
- Compare direct and indirect procedures to evaluate airway inflammation
- Examine clinical studies and patient outcomes utilizing exhaled nitric oxide
- Discuss the role of measuring exhaled nitric oxide in the clinic setting
- Review the indications/ contraindications for allergen immunotherapy
- Discuss optimal dosing regimens and extract combinations/stability
- Critique changes in the management and prevention of immunotherapy reactions
- Recognize the various presentations of vocal cord dysfunction and LPR.
- Interpret flow volume loops to help differentiate upper and lower airway obstruction
- Formulate and evaluate treatment plans along with ENT
- Evaluate patients for allergic vs. nonallergic rhinitis.
- Examine clinical studies demonstrating localized nasal IgE production
- Assess potential treatments in patients with local nasal allergy
- Evaluate the benefits of using subcutaneous vs. intravenous gammaglobulin replacement therapy
- Devise strategies to deal with local site reactions associated with subcutaneous therapy
- Compare subtleties in the management of patients receiving immunoglobulin via different routes
- Differentiate between the innate and adaptive immune system
- Determine the role of mannose binding lectin and toll-like receptors in disease states.
- Formulate an algorithm for ordering specific testing for innate immune deficiency
- Specify treatment options for patients with innate immune deficiency
- Recognize the government incentives for adoption of electronic medical records
- Determine the legal risks associated with electronic records and communication
- Specify approaches to mitigate risk when dealing with electronic records and communication
- Critically review recent findings from genome-wide association and candidate-gene studies of asthma
- Understand the basics of novel approaches to asthma genetics, including integrative genomics and epigenetics
- Comprehend the potential impact of finding asthma-susceptibility genes on disease management
- Recognize parallel epidemics of asthma and vitamin D insufficiency
- Critically review recent data supporting a link between vitamin D insufficiency and allergic diseases such as atopic asthma
- Comprehend the potential impact of vitamin D supplementation on the prevention and management of asthma
- Differentiate difficult to treat from severe asthma
- Discuss the concept of asthma phenotypes and apply them to the understanding of severe asthma
- Begin to utilize asthma phenotypes in the management of severe asthma in adults
- Discuss the role of skin barrier and immune abnormalities in AD
- Recognize the role of microbial organisms in AD
- Treat patients with AD based on an understanding of the skin barrier and immune abnormalities
- Review the pathophysiology of HAE
- Recognize and diagnose HAE
- Successfully treat patients with HAE
- Improve the outcome of patients with HAE
- Describe the spectrum of diseases in the differential diagnosis of AD
- Discuss advances in the pathophysiology of primary immunodeficiencies with eczema and aberrant IgE synthesis
- Discuss diagnostic options when dealing with diseases masquerading as AD
